

From the Rector

I read recently that the second Sunday of Easter is most likely to be the one Sunday in the year that most people would 'take off' if they were going to skip church! After the excitement of Easter Day, wonderful music, fabulous, themed preaching, and people dressed up in their Easter finery, the second Sunday of Easter is one of exhausted clergy, hoarse choirs, and diminished attendance!

To overcome this 'low' point in the Easter season, I read about one church that introduced this Sunday as 'Holy Humour Sunday', or 'Hilarity Sunday'! They did all sorts of humorous things with the liturgy to raise the energy levels and get people laughing! I thought the same as you – 'it wouldn't do to laugh in church – we can't be doing with that – it wouldn't be right!' But then I read that Holy Humour or Hilarity Sunday was first introduced in the 1200's! I know we've not got much to smile about these days, but surely, they can't be that bad?! So, I wonder if coming to church on Hilarity Sunday dressed in outlandish clothes or silly hats might catch on? Or telling even worse jokes than I usually do?! Perhaps we can make an extra effort to make someone laugh, cheer someone up, or spread some cheer around! Here's a prayer to help us on our way:

Imaginative God,

you smiled and the sun burst through the shadows of chaos; you laughed,

LOSTWITHIEL EDUCATIONAL TRUST

Are you under 25 years of age and do you live within the parishes of Lostwithiel or St Winnow? Then you may be eligible for a grant from the above Trust to help further your interests or develop your skills.

We have, in the past, contributed towards:- various large scale projects within the town (e.g. skate park, play areas), small groups such as guides/junior band and have provided grants for individuals where the applicant shows promise and interest in a particular area e.g. music, dance, sport etc. We have also allocated grants to the schools for provision of equipment and other educational facilities which benefit the children in the town.

Each application is discussed by the Trustees as to whether it falls within our remit as specified by the Charity Commission and a decision is made at meetings. Applications may be made at any time during the year through either of the contacts given below. A brief outline of what the grant would be for and the amount needed would be helpful, but after contact, should further information be required this would be requested before a decision was made.

Well into Spring now and at last we can get out into the garden, though now the knees and backs are complaining. As I write this I am hoping that all the traffic problems are sorted as Lostwithiel residents put up with a lot of confusion and mess around the streets in March. We are resilient and we coped. There is so much worse going on in the world and at least we have a roof over our heads and food and water, which is lacking in war torn countries. The Church has been asking for donations for a Shelterbox 'A Tent for Lent', as we have done in the past, which seems little enough, but every little helps!

The Celtic Eucharist is held every Thursday morning at 10.00 and is for those who wish to attend a quiet and contemplative service, with no hymns. The first in the month is for health and wholeness, so please come along if you feel anxious or troubled.

The first Sunday is as usual, the Family Eucharist, and we all await to find out what Revd. Sheila brings to her sermon.

Our second Sunday, 14th, is a Eucharist, the third, Sunday 21st, is Morning Prayer, and the fourth, 28th, a Eucharist.

On Sunday 7th we will be hosting the Duchy Opera for a concert in the Church at 7.00p.m. Please keep an eye out for posters with more details.

Our Annual Parochial Church Meeting – APCM – will be held on Thursday 11th where the reports are presented, for 2023. These reports will be available to read for all. The PCC is voted in and Churchwardens present themselves for election. Anyone is welcome to come and see how the Church is run.

The Spring Fayre is on Saturday 13^{th} in the Church Rooms, from 11 - 2.00. We will be pleased to accept suitable donations for stalls and will put boxes at the back of the Church though it is not a jumble sale.

Messy Church will take place in the Church Rooms from 4 - 5.30 on Saturday 27^{th} and all children are welcome. There are some bible stories, and craft work before a snack. Please bring your children along for some fun.

The Open the Book team is regularly acting out Bible stories in the schools and would like to welcome anybody who might be interested in helping. April – The Resurrection in the Garden.

A reflection by Canon John.

The garden needs attention. I can't remember a wetter winter and spring. The ground has been sodden and the damp induced lethargy which kept me indoors until the middle of March surely can't just be down to old age.

So it was a relief to find on a convivial Friday evening in the Ship that I wasn't alone. But Easter at the end of this month is a good target for action so I'll plant and sow, rake and prune to become part of the annual resurrection in nature.

And now there is a deadline; the dynamic mothers from the Lerryn School Association committee have arranged a Lerryn centred Garden Safari for Sunday 9th June and several of us are taking part. The garden had better be tidy for that. But they have assured me that it isn't about perfection because people can go to Heligan or Lanhydrock gardens for that; here, apparently, it will be more about curiosity and sharing.

Viv and I can cope with that modest aspiration. We console ourselves that our garden by the river really belongs to the birds anyway. so the wild corners and tatty bits are designed for them. Our tame robin seems to be the head prefect of the ten or twelve species that share our spaces and he now peers in the French windows every morning at breakfast time and demands died mealworms for himself, the blackbirds and dunnocks. He is of course obeyed. We know more about our feathered residents now because we have a new toy on our smart phones, (called 'smart' because they are smarter than us). It is an 'app' called Merlin and it records and analyses birdsong: who would have guessed there was an elusive nuthatch in the oak tree or a fugitive wren in the japonica? Good old Merlin.

Birds are so important. I wonder if children today know about them the way that we did in our childhood - Hampshire, where I grew up, boasted the most diverse landscape of any county in England. From the New Forest in the south to the chalk downs in the north, from the alluvial plains of the Southampton basin to the sandy soils of the Surrey borders. It was full of birds, and finding their nests was part of our springtime joy and boasting.

After close inspection we left them alone; 'ragging' nests and taking eggs was bad form. Sadly, It hadn't always been so. But the wonderment of a cosy hair-lined chaffinch nest or the mud lined architecture of the thrush never left me.

Apart from the random twiggery of the jackdaws and rooks, each one was perfect and each one a mystery; for how did they know about building so distinctive and proper a home for their young?

How on earth can we maintain a spirit of wonder and mystery in our lives without these minor miracles? Alleluia for the birds!

The Revd Canon Michael Geach RIP

The Revd Canon Michael Geach of Lostwithiel died on the 16th February 2024 at the age of 97. Michael served his entire ordained ministry of 70 years entirely in this diocese and in recent years, through the good offices of his son in law Patrick, he was able to be a regular attender at church services in the Benefice.

Michael was born in Falmouth in 1926, he was baptised at St Gluvias. Penryn. His parents owned a drapery shop in Penryn where they lived above the shop. Michael attended and later taught at Truro Cathedral School and Truro School. He obtained a B.A. from Queens College Cambridge, trained for the ministry at Westcott House, Cambridge and was ordained in 1953. Michael served as curate at Kenwyn, and then at Bodmin, before becoming Rector of St Dominic from 1959 to 1965. From 1965 to 1984 he was Vicar of Linkinhorne and then Rector of Veryan with Ruan Lanihorne on the Roseland from August 1984 until his retirement to Truro in 1996.

Michael was deeply involved in many Cornish organisations and institutions. He had a passion for bell ringing and was a member of the Truro Diocesan Guild of Bellringers for over 50 years. To mark his 90th Birthday he and his family donated the ten new bell ropes at St Winnow. Michael was an active member and passionate supporter of the Friends of Truro Cathedral, and was proud to have visited every church in Cornwall. He was a past Chairman of Truro Old Cornwall Society and a member of the Royal Institution of Cornwall for many years. Every year, he attended the annual dinner of the Old Truronians and was one of their longest serving members.

He had a great interest and was an advocate of the work of the Cornwall Historic Churches Trust which combined his two great loves, churches and history. At his death, his home in Lostwithiel which he shared with his daughter Caroline and Patrick, contained in excess of 6,500 books and close on 30,000 postcards

He is survived by his daughters Caroline and Penny, whose husband Martyn gave the Tribute at Michael's Requiem Mass at St Bartholomew's on Thursday 14 March 2024. The service was taken by the Rector assisted by the Benefice clergy, and it was attended by the Dean of Truro, the Very Revd Simon Robinson.

Fittingly, Canon Michael's coffin was preceded by the Dean's Verger from the Cathedral.
